

March 3: EF-4 Tornado

- 500 structures damaged in Putnam County – more than 200 totally destroyed or with major damage
- 18 dead, 88 injured
- Day of service with 1,000+ Tech volunteers
- Campus gathering on March 5





Tech Coronavirus Response

- All official university related international travel suspended indefinitely
- Task force formed, meeting twice a week
- Dedicated university web page, frequent communication
- Preparing all scenarios with goal of students completing semester with final grade





- Launched by Tech First Lady Kari Oldham
- Recognizes campus community for choosing kindness
- Promotes simple, selfless acts
- Encourages students to be bold, fearless, confident and kind



Enrollment & Diversity

- Strategic Enrollment Management Plan developed
- Overall target enrollment by Fall 2025: 12,000
- Target first-time freshman enrollment Fall 2020: 2,000
- Target transfer enrollment Fall 2020: 800
- Diversity goal Fall 2025: 22%

(Note: Fall 2019 diversity: 17%)



Budget & Legislative Updates

- Second in the funding formula
- Engineering Building
- Cybersecurity: last year of funding
- Carnegie funding





New Engineering Building

- \$5 million raised toward \$8.25 million goal
 - Over \$2.37 million in cash
 - Almost \$1 million in signed pledges
 - Over \$1.6 million in verbal agreements
- \$43.5 million is in the Governor's proposed budget





Public/Private Partnership

- Public/private partnership for living/learning residence hall
- Assessing costs with private companies v. self construction
- Goals:
 - 300 beds
 - Lower level with all innovation and maker space
 - Rental space for companies with Tech interns and co-ops
 - \$30 million





Research

- Search for Vice President for Research completed
- Office of Research internal assessment completed, VP will review and oversee changes
- Over \$20 million in activated research for FY 2019
- Over \$16 million for FY 2020
- Goal: \$40 million by FY 2026



- Spring Engineering Fair: 27% new companies, Mercedes Benz


