Approval of Agenda

Approval of November 5 Minutes

ESL and Pathway Program

Mr. Wilkerson shared with the committee that the program is scheduled to begin this summer. He is recruiting a couple of groups from South America. Prospective students are requesting to live with families in the United States. The program will be operating under the Foreign Language Department. The first group of students will be from Panama and it is a government sponsored program called Efireu.

These students will need assistant in transitioning to the United States due to not having the same access to modern conveniences like washing and drying clothes.

Status of Procedures

Mr. Wilkerson shared with the committee members that the procedures had been approved by the Administrative Council at the January 27, 2021 meeting. The procedures are effective this fall and will be provided to the President's staff in order for them to be made available on the University's website.

Status of Policies

Mr. Wilkerson shared with the committee that Policy 240 Full Course of Study Requirements for International Students was approved by the Graduate School Executive Committee at the March 2 meeting with minor edits regarding the number of weeks that students must study and by Academic Council on March 30. This policy along with 242 International Undergraduate Admissions, 243 Transfer Credit for International Undergraduate Students and 244 International Undergraduate Students Readmissions will be presented at the University Assembly meeting scheduled for April 21.

Announcements

Ms. Miller asked if there were any announcements by the members regarding international students or diversity.

Mr. Ingle announced to the committee members that the College of Engineering had set up a new fund for a non-residential merit scholarship. Since this is private dollars, international students do qualify and they are eligible to receive the scholarship.

Additionally, a grant has been set up similar to the Eagle Assistance Grant that is called the Engineering Assistance Grant. International students are eligible for this grant. This fund can be used specifically for tuition and fees. No application is needed. Any student enrolled in the College of Engineering would contact him or the staff in Clayton N. Hixson Student Success Center.

Ms. Bobbie Maynard, Dr. Mary Pashley and Ms. Becky Asher whose appointments are scheduled to expire at the end of term met to provide a chair nominee who would be willing to serve for the 2021-2022 academic year.
