United States (U.S.) export laws and regulations

In the interest of national security, the U.S. government regulates the transfer of items, information, commodities, technology, and software outside of the U.S. and to foreign persons within the U.S. Such a transfer, called an export, includes oral, written, electronic, or visual disclosure; physical shipment; hand-carrying items while traveling; and providing technical assistance.

Export regulations may also affect:

- collaboration on international research projects
- the dissemination of research results
- international travel related to teaching and research
- purchasing and procurement transactions with restricted countries and restricted end users
