Join us as we celebrate the 18th Annual Nolan Fowler Constitution Day celebration with guest speaker Dr. Elizabeth Kaufer Busch. Dr. Kaufer Busch is the co-director of the Center for American Studies and the Director of American Studies at Christopher Newport University. She holds the inaugural Laura and Pete Walker Endowed Professorship in American Studies.

Dr. Kaufer Busch's research focuses on the role of civic education in supporting democratic institutions and good governance. She has devoted extensive research to the evolving societal concepts of sex, gender and feminist thought. Dr. Kaufer Busch authored the book **Title IX: The Transformation of Sex Discrimination in Education**, in

which she examines how the 37-word Title IX law has transformed over forty years in regard to non-legislative processes.

Dr. Kaufer Busch holds a Ph.D. from Michigan State University and a B.A. in political science and sociology from Emory University.
