ATTENTION: EARLY CHILDHOOD, ELEMENTARY EDUCATION, SPECIAL EDUCATION, MIDDLE SCHOOL CANDIDATES

The Tennessee Department of Education is moving/changing the **Teaching Reading: Elementary Education (TREE: 5203)** to the **Teaching Reading: Elementary (TRE: 5205)**. Students may take either exam until the 5203 is retired August 31, 2020. If you have already taken (and passed) or registered to take either exam before August 31, 2020, no action is needed. If you are registering for a test date after the Praxis: 5203 exam expiration of August 31, 2020, you must register for Praixs 5205: Teaching Reading: Elementary.

IMPORTANT: Praxis Tip

When registering for a Praxis exam, your ETS account shows that entering your social security number is "optional." However, the Tennessee Department of Education will not enter your Praxis score(s) into the state licensure system if your social security number is not on the ETS/Praxis score report. This means, if you fail to enter your entire, correct social security number in your ETS account, you will have to contact ETS, have your social security number added, and pay an additional fee to have scores resent before the Department of Education will issue your teaching license. You can save yourself anxiety and money by entering your entire, correct social security number each time you register for a Praxis exam.

IMPORTANT: Prospective Teacher Candidates

The codes for Praxis CORE exams are changing to the following: CORE math (5733), CORE reading (5713), and CORE writing (5723). Passing scores will be accepted for both current and new exams through August 31, 2020: CORE math (5732 and 5733), CORE reading (5712 and 5713), and CORE writing (5722 and 5723). Passing scores for these exams will not change.
