Parking

Has anyone else noticed the serious lack of available gold parking spaces, even when arriving on campus as early as 8am? Could this be a consequence of the new digital parking pass system, which no longer allows faculty to see who is parking where? Without that transparency, how can faculty hold TTU Parking accountable for doing their job? We have nearly 400 full-time faculty members. If each of them purchases a gold parking pass at \$310, that's over \$120,000 just from faculty. Once you add in staff and student parking fees, the total climbs much higher. Shouldn't there be more consistent monitoring and enforcement of parking regulations? What exactly is TTU Parking doing to ensure the system is fair and functioning properly? Enrollment
