3. Department of Counseling and Psychology: modify Master's catalog language to include 7000 level courses as Advisor Guided Electives.

4. Department of English: Course Title Change Proposal, ENGL 6350 and ENGL 6640. Department of English.

5. NURSING: Catalog update, Nursing Education Concentration Credit Hours

Comments/Amendments: Dr. Jared stated this is catalog cleanup when credit hours were changed. The Nursing Education Required Concentration Core needs to change from 20 to 19 credit hours. The Practicum Requirements need to change from 5 to 6.

6. NURSING, Revise Program Admission Policy – Catalog Changes

Comments/Amendments: Dr. Jared stated the DNP concentration, Nursing and Healthcare Leadership, needs some of the verbiage cleaned up in the admissions requirements. With letters of recommendation, instead of using someone academic the student can provide a more current recommendation.

7. NURSING: Deletion of GRE for Joint DNP Program – Catalog Changes

Comments/Amendments: Dr. Jared stated this request is for the DNP program. During COVID, the GRE was waived. Nursing is requesting to delete the GRE going forward. Dr. Gotcher asked if it would be permanently and Dr. Jared said yes. Dr. Gotcher asked how does the Graduate School look at the GRE. Dr. Camuti stated universities are getting rid of the GRE. We are leaving it up to the department. No one is on a waiver. If a department wants to make a permanent change, it would need to go through the approval process. Dr. Wendt stated they are keeping the GRE at the PhD level, but they do provide different pathways for MA and EdS students.

8. Department of Chemistry: Update MS Chemistry admissions requirements

Comments/Amendments: Dr. Callender stated the Department of Chemistry is making a change to remove the GRE from the requirements with the exception of students with a GPA less than 3.0. For students who have a GPA of 3.0 or greater, a GRE score will not be required, but students may still submit GRE scores. GRE scores are only required if the GPA is below 3.0. The Department of Chemistry is also changing to look at outstanding potential for advanced study and research demonstrated through work or

research experience. Students may have prior research or work experience that is not reflected in their undergraduate GPA.

9. College of Business: MACC Graduate electives catalog changes

Comments/Amendments: Dr. Pharr stated that students are required to take 6 elective hours from an approved elective list. Instead students can take any 5000 or 6000 level class with the prefix ACCT, BMGT, DS, ECON, FIN, or MKT, except ACCT 6010.

10. College of Business: MBA editorial changes to the admissions section of the Graduate Catalog

14. Other Matters: A discussion took place regarding out of state tuition fees and that these rate may be prohibitive to recruiting out of state students.
