- 10. Course Objectives/Student Learning Outcomes
- 11. Major Teaching Methods (which might include, but would not be limited to: lectures, labs, demonstrations, discussion, reading, or written assignments)
- 12. Special Instructional Platform/Materials (laptop, clicker, calculator, software, etc.)
- 13. Topics to be Covered
- 14. Course Schedule
- 15. Grading and Evaluation Procedures
- 16. Course Policies
  - a. Attendance Policy
  - b. Class Participation
  - c. Assignments & Related Policy
  - d. \*Instructional and Assignment Use of Artificial Intelligence
  - e. \*\*Student Academic Integrity Policy or expanded statement if appropriate
