HON 4013-801 Honors Asian American Culture and History Colloquium

This class will examine the history of Asian immigration to the United States and the cultures of various Asian American groups. The course will focus on the contributions and successes of Asian Americans in the United States. Students will view several films and episodes (including *Crazy, Rich Asians, Fresh Off the Boat*, and *Kim's Convenience*), watch Asian American comedians, read two graphic novels, and hear from Asian American guest speakers who will share their experiences followed by discussion. The goal of the course is to foster greater knowledge and understanding among students of Asian American history and culture, and its place within the broader framework of U.S. History and Pop Culture.
