ESSAY QUESTIONS: Choose TWO (2) of the following prompts.

- Each essay should be a least 300 words long, and must be entirely your own work.
- Avoid cliché and "easy" answers, as the purpose of these essays are to explore the ways that you might benefit from what Tech Honors offers.
- For each prompt that you select, begin the essay with the letter corresponding to your choice. (For example, if you choose prompt B, then place a B at the beginning of your essay.)

Topic choices: Do not repeat the same information in your two essays.

- A. Write about a course you've taken in college that has made a significant but unexpected impact on the way you think about your future career. Be specific—don't rely on generalizations. This is a good question to choose if you have been truly surprised by the change or unanticipated type of growth you've encountered as a result.
- B. If your experiences <u>outside</u> the classroom during college have made a big impact on your intellectual development: what are they, and <u>what did you take away from those experiences</u>? Rather than focusing on a course (as in topic A above), this question is about your insights about related or seemingly unrelated events. Avoid generic answers—show why this is <u>your</u> experience, not that of many other students at this time.
- C. If (and only if) there is a social issue that you wish to address in a way that is not typically addressed by people in your intended profession: how do you plan to do so as a part of your career, why, and how will you prepare for it during your remaining academic career?
- D. If you would like to go to graduate school (or another kind of advanced professional program), what are your assumptions about what <u>you</u> need to do in the next two or three years besides getting high scores and grades in the right courses? What is your dream grad school, and why?—Or, if you do not have a certain school in mind, what are the qualities you wish to find in a graduate program?
- E. If you are currently enrolled in an honors program or college, describe it in your own words (not those of any official information), and write about your own experiences as part of Honors. What aspects of your Honors journey do you wish to continue and how? And in what ways do you want to shape and alter your experience through opportunities in Honors at Tech?
- F. If you are currently enrolled at Tech and wish to join the Tech Honors Program, describe in your own words (not those of any official information) what has made you determine that you will benefit from completing Honors requirements at Tech. You might want to include information about what you have done so far as a Tech student, and what you've discovered about Honors; what persuaded you that Honors would be beneficial, and what would you bring to the Honors community?
