Threshold of Acceptability: Performance at a level within 10% of the national mean on the ETS Major Field Examination Sociology content areas is expected. If scores are below the national mean, faculty will re-evaluate.*ETS institutional username and password is now required to obtain comparative data for institutions for annual information.

Modifications for Improvement:

- The California Critical Thinking Skills Test (CCTST) was added as a new measure of critical
 thinking in 2020-2021 and Sociology continues to meet its threshold of acceptability. The CCTST
 is a senior exit exam taken by all graduate seniors at Tennessee Tech University. The University
 expects program scores to be above a 90% threshold in comparison to the TTU institutional
 score with the goal of 100%.
- 2. To expand curricular options, Sociology and Political Science now house the NSF-grant funded "Cyber Crime, Law and Society Minor" in collaboration with the College of Engineering. See Appendix 2 for Curriculum. Threshold of Acceptability: Political Science and Sociology anticipated 5-10 students to be interested in the grant-funded minor three years ago when first writing the NSP application with PI Dr. Ambareen Siraj. Ten students in the POLS 1030-777 CYBER sections remains the acceptable limit. This fall the section had to be opened from an initial enrollment of 25 to a double section.
