Mission:

The mission of the School of Music is to provide the best possible preparation for careers and/or graduate studies in teaching and music performance. The offerings of the School of Music also enable students to build and share in an enriched life through participation in activities in music; to broaden the cultural perspective of the community, state, and region; and to instill in all University students a keen appreciation of music.

PROGRAM GOAL: MUSICAL ENRICHMENT

Define Outcome:

Through numerous performances, the School will provide a rich musical experience for students, members of the Tech community and beyond.

Assessment Methods:

The School maintains a list of events such as recitals, concerts, large ensembles, masterclasses, chamber groups and guest artists.

Criteria for Success (Thresholds for Assessment Methods):

The more events that are attended, the greater the musical experience.

SLO 1: THE STUDENT WILL UNDERSTAND AND APPLY MUSIC THEORY CONCEPTS AND SKILLS.

Define Outcome:

- A. The student will be able to hear, identify and work conceptually with the elements of music such as rhythm, melody, harmony, structure, timbre and texture.
- B. The student will have the ability to read and analyze musical notation.

Assessment Methods:

- A. Final exam in Harmony and Aural Training 4 demonstrating the ability to hear, identify and work conceptually with the elements of music. (*Direct Measure of Learning*)
- B. Measure: Two composition projects completed in Harmony IV (*Direct Measure of Learning*)

Criteria for Success (Thresholds for Assessment Methods):

- A. Achievement Target: 75% of students will meet minimum standards on the comprehensive final in Harmony IV.
- B. Achievement Target: 75% of students will meet minimum standards on the two composition projects in Harmony IV.

Results and Analysis:

In Spring 2023, 31 students were enrolled in Harmony IV. 29 students (93%) met the minimum standard on the comprehensive final exam. 30 students (96%) met the minimum standards on the two composition projects.

In Spring 2023, 31 students were enrolled in Aural Skills IV. 27 (87%) met the minimum standards on the comprehensive final exam. The results indicate that the material was understood, and the assessment target was met.

Use of Results to Improve Outcomes:

The results indicate that the target was met. Over 75% of the students are demonstrating an understanding of music theory concepts and skills.

Last year, we created a remedial section of Harmony I and II and experienced good success. We are curious to see if these students will be successful in the fully-integrated sections of Harmony III/IV.

For Fall 2023, we are continuing remedial sections for Harmony I/II and are integrating this model into the corresponding AT I/II courses, for the first time.

SLO 2: ALL MUSIC STUDENTS WILL UNDERSTAND MUSIC HISTORY.**Define Outcome:**

- A. The student will have the ability to synthesize and demonstrate the relationship of music within historical context.
- B. The student will have knowledge of non-western, popular, folk/primitive/ethnic genres.

Assessment Methods:

- A. Oral and written exam from Music History I and Music History II (*Direct Measure of Learning*)
- B. Measure: Final grade in Music Appreciation (*Direct Measure of Learning*)

Criteria for Success (Thresholds for Assessment Methods):

- A. Achievement Target: 75% of students will meet minimum standards on the final exams in Music History I and Music History II.

- B. Achievement Target: 75% of students will meet minimum standards on the final grade in Music Appreciation.

Results and Analysis:

In Fall 2022, Music History I had 25 students enrolled. On the final comprehensive exam, 22 met the minimum standards (88%).

In Spring 2023, Music History II had 23 students enrolled. On the final comprehensive exam, 21 met the minimum standards (91%).

In Spring 2023, Music Appreciation had 52 students enrolled. 41 met minimum standards (79%) on the final grade in Music Appreciation.

Use of Results to Improve Outcomes:

The Music History results indicate that the target was met. Over 75% of the students are demonstrating an understanding of music history and literature.

The Music Appreciation results indicate that the target was met. Over 75% of the students have demonstrated sufficient knowledge of non-western, popular, folk/primitive/ethnic genres.

In order to improve the flow and efficiency between our 3 music history courses (Music Appreciation, Music History I/II) we have assigned all 3 courses to the same Instructor, Dr. Jeff Womack. We hope this will eliminate previous course redundancies and improve flow of content.

SLO 3: THE STUDENT WILL UNDERSTAND CURRENT MUSIC SOFTWARE, INCLUDING VISUAL AND AUDIO MEDIA RELEVANT TO MUSIC MAKING AND MUSIC TEACHING.

Define Outcome:

The student will demonstrate understanding of current music software, visual and audio media relevant to music making and music teaching.

Assessment Methods:

Measures: Final project in Computer Applications Class demonstrating the use of music software and visual/audio media. (Direct Measure of Learning)

Criteria for Success (Thresholds for Assessment Methods):

Achievement Target: 75% of students will meet minimum standards on the final project in Computer Applications Class

Results and Analysis:

In Fall 2022, 16 students were enrolled in the Computer Applications course and 15 (93%) met minimum standards on the final project in the Computer Applications course.

In spring 2023, 14 students were enrolled in the Computer Applications course and 14 (100%) met minimum standards on the final project in the Computer Applications course.

Use of Results to Improve Outcomes:

The results indicate that the target was met. Over 75% of the students met the minimum standards on the final project in Computer Applications Class.

SLO 4: STUDENTS WILL HAVE BASIC PIANO KEYBOARD SKILLS REQUIRED TO BE ABLE TO WORK IN A CLASSROOM SETTING.**Define Outcome:**

Students will demonstrate basic piano keyboard skills required to be able to work in a classroom setting.

Assessment Methods:

Measures: Piano proficiency in Class Piano IV (Direct Measure of Learning)

Criteria for Success (Thresholds for Assessment Methods):

Achievement Target: 75% of students will take and pass the Piano Proficiency upon first attempt.

Results and Analysis:

In Spring 2023, 22 students were enrolled in Piano Class IV. 17 students (77%) passed the proficiency on their first attempt. 5 students failed (23%) and received an incomplete in the course.

Use of Results to Improve Outcomes:

The results indicate that the target was met. Over 75% of the students passed the Piano Proficiency on the first attempt.

This is a vast improvement from last year, in which 27% passed. Our actions of diversifying our instructors, extending office hours, and establishing tutoring, have yielded positive results.

SLO 5: MUSIC EDUCATION STUDENTS WILL BE PREPARED FOR A CAREER IN MUSIC EDUCATION AND MUSIC TEACHING.

Define Outcome:

Students will demonstrate readiness to teach K-12 music.

Assessment Methods:

Measures: PRAXIS II – Music: Content and Instruction (*Direct Measure of Learning*)

Criteria for Success (Thresholds for Assessment Methods):

Achievement Target: 75% of students will take and pass the PRAXIS II upon first attempt.

Results and Analysis:

In 2022-2023, 9 students attempted the PRAXIS II – Music Content and Instruction exam. 5 students (55%) passed on their first attempt. Therefore, the target was not met.

Use of Results to Improve Outcomes:

In order to improve PRAXIS II test scores, the School of Music will continue all of the improvement measures implemented last year. This includes increased Practicum hours, free tutoring, faculty led study sessions, and lab ensembles. In addition, the School of Music has hired a new faculty member, Dr. Kexin Xu, and has been tasked with creating new course content for Intro to Music Education and Material and Methods, K-5. We have also formed a music education committee to finish revising our increased Practicum requirements.

Summative Evaluation:

- **SLO1:** The School of Music plans to continue remedial sections of Harmony I/II. Additionally, the department plans to integrate this model into AT I/II as well.
- **SLO2:** In order to improve the flow and efficiency between our three music history courses (Music Appreciation, Music History I/II) we have assigned all three courses to the same Instructor, Dr. Jeff Womack. We hope this will eliminate previous course redundancies and improve flow of content.
- **SLO5:** In order to improve PRAXIS II test scores, the School of Music will continue all of the improvement measures implemented last year. This includes increased Practicum hours, free tutoring, faculty-led study sessions, and lab ensembles. In addition, the School of Music has hired a new faculty member, Dr. Kexin Xu, and has been tasked with creating new course content for Intro to Music Education and Material and Methods, K-5. We have also formed a music education committee to finish revising our increased Practicum requirements.
