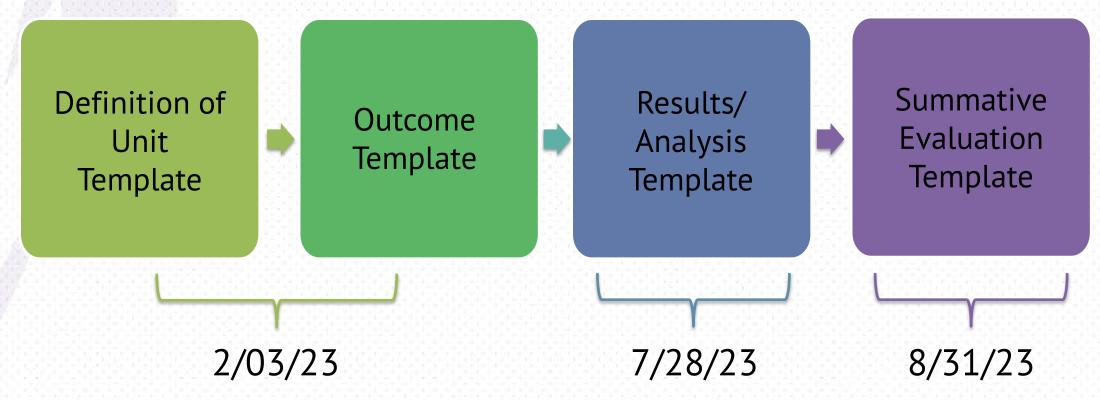

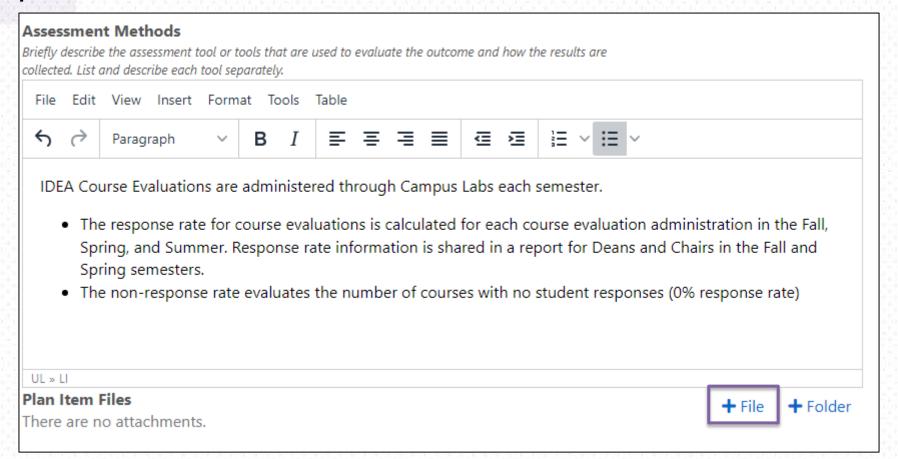

Results/Analysis

Definition

Results - Summary of data collected

Questions to ask

- O What were the findings?
- How do the results compare to the last time this outcome was assessed?
- O Were the results what was expected?





Use of Results

Definition

 Use of Results – Based on the data collected, what actions will be taken to improve delivery of programs and services; how will the results be used for continuous improvement

Questions to ask

- Where is the department/program succeeding in accomplishing its goals?
 - Are there some areas where improvements are needed?
- O What steps will be taken to improve outcomes/student learning?
- If changes were made based on prior year's assessment results, what was the impact of those changes?



Tips for Results/Use of Results

- 1. Display trend/historical results when available
- 2. Provide results for all assessment methods
- 3. Directly address each Criteria for Success in the narrative
- 4. Discuss any Action Plans (current or future) associated with the outcome
- 5. Qualitative information can provide helpful context

ENGL4995-Senior Colloquium Rubric: A rubric was developed in 2012-13 to assess student oral presentations in our departmental capstone course, English 4995-Senior Colloquium. This presentation is a culminating project focused on historical traditions in British Literature. The rubric was used to assess presentations in the capstone. Relevant Rubric Categories: Student presented using correct diction, syntax, usage, grammar, and mechanics. Student used few fillers and maintained an extemporaneous style. Questions to ask

- 1. What action are being planned or implemented for the next planning cycle?
- 2. What changes (if any) are being made to the assessment plan including a change to assessment methods, criteria for success, etc?

Takeaways

- 1. Results/Analysis addresses attainment of success criteria
- 2. Use of Results outlines current or future actions to seek improvement
- **3. Summative Evaluation** provides a brief summary of actions to take place in the next report cycle
