RN-to-BSN Online Degree Program

Our fully-online RN-to-BSN program will help you take your career as an RN to the next level! Offering year -round enrollment and a flexible schedule that can be completed at your own pace, our RN-to-BSN program is completed by most students in 3-to-4 semesters. Students meet the 120-credit-hour requirement for our BSN degree through the following combination of courses:

ASSOCIATE PROGRAM NURSING CREDITS

Up to 32 hours of Nursing credit can be transferred from your Associates in Nursing program. These 32 hours are listed in GOLD on the reverse.

RN—TO-BSN COURSES

30 hours of online Nursing credit are completed through our online course offerings. These courses are listed in WHITE on the reverse.

GEN ED COURSES


58 hours of General Education courses make up the remainder of our BSN requirements. ASN and AASN programs include courses that will satisfy many of these general education requirements, and any remaining requirements can be be completed through TTU or through a Tennessee community college. These courses are listed in **PURPLE** on the reverse.

Students should email an unofficial copy of their transcripts to **nursing@tntech.edu** to see which general education courses may transfer to fulfill requirements for the RN-to-BSN Curriculum.

Students can start the RN-BSN program for Fall, Spring, or Summer semester, but you should submit your application 6 weeks in advance of the semester start. It is okay to apply while your RN license is pending, but if you have an active license it must be unencumbered.
