## **Guidelines**

- For Application Template of Congressionally Directed Spending (CDS), <u>please click here</u>, and use either CDS or Plus Up application template.
- Please submit your request (using the application template for CDS) to Jill Dicey (<u>jdicey@tntech.edu</u>).
- CDS or Plus Up applications and CDS budgets should not exceed 2 pages each (with no less than 12 pt font and 1-inch margins).
- Two letters of support are not needed at this time, but are required for CDS projects after being selected by the University to move forward.



## Informational items

- Congress made the decision to restore Congressionally Directed Spending (earmarks) in FY22, but details are variable from year to year.
- There are a limited "slots", so to speak, for each state and universities. Proposed projects should focus on those that have a high impact to the region and nation but are not addressed by competitive grant programs of the federal funding agencies.
- The House website states, "Community engagement and support is crucial in determining which projects are worthy of Federal funding. Only projects with demonstrated community support will be considered." Therefore, projects related to community service efforts, economic development, and public impact may get a better chance to be funded.
- Collaborative efforts by teaming up with experts from another state may have a better chance to get some funding, but obviously, if funded, the resources will be divided depending on congressional directions.

Employment and Training Administration – direct services to individuals to enhance employment opportunities and have a link to State or local workforce investment system.  HRSA (Health Resources and Services Administration) Health Facilities Construction and Equipment – can cover cost of construction, renovation, or capital equipment for facilities for provision of health, mental health, substance abuse services, training of health professionals. No salary funding allowed.  SAMSHA (Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services) Mental Health, Substance Abuse Treatment, Substance Abuse Prevention- Focus on promotion and prevention projects.
