several cars around our Cookeville ignore the existing signs and drive at Whereas. reckless speeds near the University campus, and,

upgrading regular crosswalk signs to have flashing lights and adding more Whereas, signs where there are absences, notably at the intersection of Seventh Street and Mahler Avenue, and,

along with the previously stated location upgrading regular crosswalk signs to Whereas. have flashing lights and adding more signs where there are absences, to address crosswalks connecting to North Dixie Avenue, and,

the simple addition of new crosswalk signs and upgrading the old ones will be an effective way to improve student-pedestrian safety, and,
