- Concerns about the guidance professors received from upper administration on how to address COVID concerns.
- Residential Life and other services on campus are given various information.
- Lack of advice for students on where to receive tests on or off campus.
- Misinformation about vaccines at Health Services

- Professors asking for test results as a violation of student privacy
- Lack of social distancing on campus in the event a student wanted to take those precautions
- Lack of guidance in situations of close contact or exposure
