April really ramped up progress for the Talon Project, with Campus Roadshows, Business Process Demonstrations, and the Spring Town Hall all taking place throughout the month. Each of these events has provided opportunities for the campus community to learn more about the Talon Project and the improvements it will bring.

The Campus Roadshows are individualized meetings that offer departments an opportunity to receive an overview of the new Talon system, including what systems will no longer be used and what training will be provided, as well as an opportunity to ask any questions individuals may have. Departments that would like to participate can sign up through their <u>Business Partner</u>.

Business process demonstrations continued to take place for the **Business Partner** Network (BPN), including demonstrations on requisitions and appointments for GAs, lecturers, and instructors. The BPN is a great resource for those wanting to learn more.

The Spring Town Hall was a successful and well-attended event with participants both inperson and virtually. President Oldham and Dr. Stinson offered opening remarks at the event, thanking participants for their commitment to a successful transition to Talon.

Participants also had the opportunity to see a live demonstration of the Absence function, which will be utilized by all employees who are eligible for leave. Some benefits to the new reporting program include real-time leave balance accounting and a "Calculate" tool that allows users to plan for future leave.
