
2024 Year in Review

As we turn the page on 2024 and enter the start of a new year, we want to provide a summary of the key Talon project activities that have transpired in the past year, including:

- Establishing a partnership with Huron Consulting as the Talon implementation partner.
- Kicking off the project in September of 2024.
- Developing a monthly newsletter, Talon Tracks, and a video chat, Talon Talks, with project team members.
- Forming the Business Partner Network (BPN), comprised of over 40 employees, to obtain department-level involvement and input from business, finance, and HR users.
- Completing the foundation and define phases of the project with substantial progress in the design phase, including the completion of the first Conference Room Pilot (CRP), which includes:
 - Buildout of the new Chart of Accounts, Project Portfolio Management (PPM) for grants and capital projects, procurement functionality, enterprise reporting, and human capital management (HCM) functions for recruitment, onboarding, time and leave reporting, benefits, and payroll processing.

This year is already shaping up to be very busy with a variety of project-related activities that will require significant time, effort and focus from the project team members, with heavy involvement from the business, finance, IT, and HR areas.

These activities will include final design work, system testing, data integration and conversions, developing and providing user training and system validations. These activities are essential to achieve the system go-live date of Jan. 1, 2026.
